

The church separates from Evangelical Free Church as an independent non-denominational congregation & changes its name to Bethesda Church

2000 Pastor Mark Matychuk is installed as Bethesda's Senior Pastor

2007 A large classroom expansion is built on the church to rent to a school

2015 Pastor Brent Befus is appointed Interim Pastor, then as Senior Pastor a year later

Our Beliefs

We at Bethesda believe that there is no substitute for a right relationship with God our Creator. This peace with our Maker is only possible through His Son Jesus Christ. The Bible, God's Word to mankind, informs us how to receive Jesus Christ and have a meaningful life in this world. Therefore, we endeavor to share our understanding of God, Jesus Christ and the Bible in practical ways that make sense, and which will enrich all who attend our Services.

The Bible

We believe in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as verbally inspired of God (II Timothy 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21), and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and life (Hebrews 4:12).

The Godhead

We believe in one God (Deuteronomy 6:4; John 10:30), eternally existing in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit (I Timothy 2:5; II Corinthians 13:14).

Person of Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit (Luke 1:35), and born of the Virgin Mary, and is true God and true man (Philippians 2:6-9; John 1:1-2, 14; Romans 1:3-4).

Holy Spirit

We believe the Holy Spirit is a person, who convicts the world of sin (John 16:8), and who regenerates, baptizes, indwells, enlightens, and empowers (Titus 3:5; I Corinthians 12:13; Ephesians 1:13, 17, 18; 3:16).

Man's Condition

We believe that man was created in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-27), but that in Adam's sin the race fell (Romans 3:23; 5:12), inherited a sinful nature, became alienated from God (Ephesians 2:1-3, 12), and is totally unable to please God in this lost condition (Romans 3:9-12; 8:7-8).

Redemption

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sin according to the Scriptures as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice (II Corinthians 5:21), and that all who believe in His finished work are justified by His shed blood (Romans 3:23-26; Ephesians 1:7). This complete salvation is bestowed as the free gift of God (Ephesians 2:8-9). All those who are thus saved are eternally secure in Christ (Philippians 1:6; Romans 8:1, 38-39; Ephesians 4:30).

Salvation

We believe that all who receive by faith the Lord Jesus Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit (Acts 16:31; Romans 6:23, Ephesians 1:13), and thereby become children of God (Romans 8:15-17), and members of the Body of Christ (I Corinthians 12:13).

Resurrection

We believe in the bodily resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 15:12-20), in His ascension into heaven, and in His present life there for us as High Priest and Advocate (I John 2:1). Likewise, we believe that all men will be raised, the just to everlasting glory (I Corinthians 15:21-22), and the unjust to everlasting conscious suffering (John 5:28-29; Revelation 20:11-15).

Return of Christ

We believe the rapture of the Church and the second coming of Christ will be pre-millennial. He will come first to receive the Church unto Himself (I Thessalonians 4:13-18; Philippians 3:20, 21), and then come to establish His Millennial Kingdom, over which He will reign (Zechariah 14:4, 9; Acts 1:10,11; Revelation 19:11-16; 20:1-4). Because of the nature of the Body of Christ, the resurrection and rapture of the Church, which is His Body, will take place before the Great Tribulation (Jeremiah 30:7; Matthew 24:15-31; I Thessalonians 1:10, 5:9) at His appearing in the air (I Thessalonians 4:13-18; Philippians 3:20, 21; Titus 2:13, 14; I Corinthians 15:51-53), the resurrection of the Old Testament and Tribulation saints will occur after the Tribulation and they will reign with Christ for a thousand years (Revelation 20:4-6).



Our Core Values

We see our church not simply as a house of worship with walls, a roof and open doors. Rather, we believe that the church is actually the members and believers that come together to practice God's word, celebrate His love and extend His gifts. Our Core Values demonstrate what is most important and what we must live if we are to remain

"Bethesda Church." These Core Values guide our ministries, programs, and the life of our church. As a result, we will evaluate all of what we do with these five Core Values in mind. These include:

Bible Centered

We approach the Bible as of first importance. What we do, what we believe, and what we teach comes from the authority of God's Word. The Bible is central in all we do, taking precedence over church tradition, a shifting culture and especially, our own opinion (2 Tim. 3:16).



Grace Theology

We approach church life and programs through

a Dispensational perspective. At the heart of our theological position is the message Christ committed to the Apostle Paul regarding the outpouring of God's grace in forming the Church, which is comprised of all people without distinction who come to Christ through faith (Eph. 3:1-6). We teach and edify believers in the importance of handling God's Word correctly (2 Tim. 2:15).

Grace Living

We put our theology into action by the way we live our lives. We desire that, through loving, authentic relationships, we can confront what does not belong, encourage, and bear each other's burdens so that we



address the various struggles in our lives. We desire to avoid the bonds of legalism by demonstrating love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, against which there is no law (Gal. 5:22, 23).

Multigenerational

We love a multigenerational approach to life and ministry more than we love our own particular preferences. This means we want to approach ministry, programs, and functions with all the different generations in mind and focus. This means our church life will be tailored to all ages to include the youngest to the oldest.

This also means we want our church leadership to reflect the different generations. To achieve this, we commit to pursue training, mentoring, and discipling the next generation so they can take the place of our current leadership (2 Tim. 2:2). We will develop interns and provide genuine opportunities for the next generation to practice their gifts.

Missional

We have a heart for the lost both in our neighborhood and abroad. The Apostle Paul's heart was to see those who do not know Christ to be transformed and he wanted believers to do everything they could in their speech and conduct to promote Christ as well. We have a desire for our community to know Christ and be transformed by Him (1 Cor. 9:22-23).

We also value foreign missions and thank God for the various spheres of influence he has given us around the world. We will continue to support and encourage missionaries to promote the Gospel of the Grace of God while we do our part where we work, play, and live.







Worship & Music

Philosophy

Over the past three years, the Bethesda Church Worship Team has committed to a more traditional presentation of music in the Sunday service. Hymns comprise the majority of music for worship while still including a tasteful blend of contemporary worship music both vocally and instrumentally. Two or three worship leaders lead the congregation in worship each Sunday. The worship leaders are supported by a band including piano, guitar, clarinet, bassoon, violin, trombone, and drums. Both the band and the worship leaders endeavored to bring a spirit of praise and worship directed to God, our Creator.

Bethesda Church also presents a choir once or twice a month to enhance the worship experience. The choir presentations emphasize meaningful selections from many of the great hymn writers of times past. The choir is small but effective with great leadership.

Music is a catalyst to confirm the truths of the Word of God and enrich the experience of corporate gatherings while proclaiming the greatness of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Twin Cities Metropolitan Area

Bethesda Church is located on the border of Prior Lake and Savage, situated about 25 miles south of Minneapolis and 28 miles southwest of St. Paul, the capital of Minnesota.

Bethesda Church also has a sister church to serve the northeastern community of the Twin Cities in North Branch. It is situated 45 miles north of Minneapolis and 43 miles north of St Paul.

The Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan area is a thriving community of nearly 3 million people, in 7 counties and 182 communities, encompassing nearly 3,000 square miles. Our region is home to 19 "Fortune 500" corporations and boasts a highly educated workforce. Our average household income is among the highest in the nation, and our unemployment rate is among the lowest. Thriving arts, music and theatre communities, and professional sports teams help make our region a magnet for creative, young professionals. Our renowned park system includes 52 state parks and 340 miles of interconnected trails!

Prior Lake Facilities

Bethesda Church's beautiful facilities are extensive and offer plenty of growth opportunities. Boasting over 40,000 square feet, the church offers a full size gymnasium, a dedicated oversize youth room, 10+ classrooms, a board room, a commercial grade kitchen, an extensive fellowship hall for hosting formal and informal events, and a smaller chapel for more intimate events. There are 7 spacious church offices and a reception area for full and part-time church staff in a dedicated space within the church. The main sanctuary comfortably seats 250+ people. The parking lot is large and has approximately 200 spaces. The church sits on 7.5 acres of land, some of which is wooded, and has great visibility to a hightraffic county highway (13), but the entrance is on a much quieter, safer frontage road.

The church hosts a number of organizations who use the building extensively throughout the week and year. In 2006, Bethesda built a series of classrooms to rent to an area charter school, which supplemented the mortgage. Currently, this space is rented to El Bosque Encantado, a Spanish immersion preschool. The church is also used by organizations, like the Boy Scouts of America Troop 333, area homeschool groups, Alpha Women's Center, River South Bible Church, & a community voting center, among others.

Board of Elders

With respect to ecclesiology, we are a congregational church. As such we believe that Christ has vested the authority of His Church not in a hierarchy of professionals, but in the members of the local congregation itself, especially as they are represented in a local body of Elders whom we elect.
